

Despite a strong and early offensive start, the Saskatchewan Roughriders will have to wait a little longer for their first win of the season as they fell 30-17 to the Winnipeg Blue Bombers in front of a standing-room only crowd at Investors Group Field on Saturday night. Winnipeg's Jovon Johnson returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown, and his touchdown reception in the third quarter brought the home crowd to their feet. Winnipeg's Chris Matthews and Cody Fajardo combined for 347 yards and three touchdowns for the Blue

Bombers, who won their first CFL game since Week 7 of the 2016 season. The Riders led early on, scoring on their first possession of the game, as they got the ball first and quarterback Matt Nichols scrambled for a 12-yard gain. Nichols and fellow running back Kieran LaFrance both gained four yards on the next play before Nichols threw to DaVaris Daniels for a 15-yard touchdown pass. The score capped a six-play, 72-yard drive that took just over two minutes off the clock. But the Bombers answered on their first offensive drive, as Johnson returned the second-half kickoff 96 yards to paydirt. Matthews then caught a

29-yard touchdown pass from Fajardo to give the Bombers a 7-3 lead. Winnipeg's offence struggled in the first half, but the defence did a good job of limiting the Riders' offence. The Bombers managed just one first down in the first half, but still had the ball first-and-goal at the Saskatchewan two-yard line after a second-down field goal. The drive stalled and the Riders went into the half with a seven-point deficit. The Riders came out of the locker room with a vengeance in the second half, scoring on their first two drives of the half. Saskatchewan's offence took a page out of the Buffalo Bills' playbook as they moved the ball downfield using short passes. The Riders had four first downs in the half and their two-minute drill resulted in a touchdown. The Riders had a chance to go ahead, but Nichols' second-down pass to Brandon Banks was picked off by Marquay McDaniel.

Winnipeg responded with a touchdown drive of their own. The Bombers put together a 12-play, 85-yard drive that took just over five minutes off the clock. Johnson made 82157476af
